POSITION ANNOUNCEMENT

Seasonal Invasive Red Swamp Crayfish Technician

Genesee Conservation District (GCD) is seeking applications for employment as an Invasive Red Swamp Crayfish Technician working primarily at a red swamp crayfish infestation in Livingston County. This person will be working closely with the GiLLS CISMA Coordinator. The GiLLS CISMA is the Genesee, Lapeer, Livingston, and Shiawassee Cooperative Invasive Species Management Area.

Applicants should have a college education in natural or environmental science and/or teaching and general knowledge about invasive species problems and prevention.

The technician will primarily conduct field work for invasive red swamp crayfish in and around Howell, MI, with chances to interact with the public at events. This person will also be responsible for assisting the GiLLS CISMA Coordinator with surveying/mapping events as well as other CISMA functions that aid in deliverables throughout the four-county area associated with the GiLLS CISMA strategic plan. This person may also be called on to assist with other outreach activities.

Applicants should be comfortable working outside in field conditions on land and water, and with exposure to variable weather conditions, temperatures, and insects. The schedule for this job includes during the day, evenings, and weekends, as needed, working a flexible schedule.

The technician will work under the direction of the GCD Administrator and the GiLLS CISMA Coordinator.

Pay rate will be \$15.00/hour to \$16.00/hour based on experience. A valid Michigan driver's license and reliable transportation is required. This is a seasonal, part-time position that will occur between May and September 2025. Actual hours per week will vary according to workload and are expected to average around 20 hours per week.
